







- Recipients represent the number of persons receiving at least one UI benefit payment during the month.
- The number of UI recipients typically decrease from March to April with an increase in employment in seasonal industries like Construction.

- The maximum duration of UI benefits for most UI claimants is 26 weeks.
- The duration of UI benefits remained steady at 13.3 for the month of April. The average duration of UI benefits over the past 10 years is 13.5 weeks.

These characteristics do not necessarily reflect job leavers, new entrants, reentrants, and benefit exhaustees. According to the UI Data Summary publication, about 38% of unemployed persons in Iowa received UI benefits.
